

Agne Kuimet:

In 2018 the Estonian *Coalition for Sustainable Development* as a partnership platform was created. This coalition unites non-governmental organizations, bigger and smaller private sector enterprises and corporations (such as DHL and Telia) and state institutions (such as Ministry of Environment, Governments Office etc.) in order to support Agenda 2030 based actions and to popularize sustainable development as a narrative. The Coalition came out with a good-will memorandum to show their commitment in helping Estonia reach Sustainable Development Goals, with their expertise and actions, which combines civil society's knowledge on how to build a more sustainable society, the private sector's economic power to move towards it and policy makers interested in contributing to a good governance model.

The goals of the Coalition include awareness rising on sustainable development (mainstreaming SDGs among citizens and businesses) and reaching a new form of advocacy work - cross-sectoral "around the table" advocacy, delegating some messages to private sector partners for example to enhance cooperation between state, private sector and NGOs.

Recent bigger activities have been facilitating events for wider audiences such as an open EU elections debate with local EP candidates on sustainable development issues, open public story-based campaign on SDGs and awareness rising interdisciplinary event in local democracy festival Opinionfestival. Coalition has been part of creating state of national strategy "Estonia 2035" by giving input both on sustainability and global issues. Coalition members participated in data collection for VNR this spring as well.

Coalition has stated to continue for another period of actions, since members feel their role and impact on overall popularisation of SDGs happening so far. And our goal is to go further and do even more.
